
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Membership in the online CAID Arachne's Web group is free and open to the public, though initial posts are moderated.

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Early Bobbin Lace Making Images



The Orb leaders' quarterly reports are due at or by the meeting. You can present them at the meeting, or get the report to me and I'll read it at the meeting.



First Quarter Meeting



Quick Crocheted Bobbin Keeper

By Lynnette de Sandoval del Valle de los Unicornios (Debbie Coyle)

Chain 31

DC in the 30th chain stitch

*Chain 1, DC (skipping a chain stitch in the base chain) *

Repeat between the asterisks (*) to the end of the chain.

This makes 14 bobbin spaces..





Lace Knitting History: A Short Trip Down the Internet Rabbit Hole By Lynnette de Sandoval del Valle de los Unicornios (Debbie Coyle)


The Arachne's Web guild allows all types of modern lace knitting as one of our lace forms, most of that was not done during the SCA's time period. But there is evidence that some open work knitting was being done during the Middle Ages.

"Knit and purl patterns appear in the second half of the 16th C., and around the same time we see the first use of eyelets (again, Eleonora of Toledo's stockings being one of the early examples). However,fully-developed "lace" knitting and the other modern techniques don't appear until the late 18th or 19th C." ^[1]

Example #1: "To date, the earliest garment featuring lace faggoting in diagonals, is a mid 16th century pair of silk trouser hose, kept in the Dresden Museum." ^[2]



Also note the finished openings for the puffs.



Example #2:"From a diagonal to a simple diamond is the next step. A piece of knitting now in the Edinburgh Museum, dated late 17th century and featuring simple lace diamonds, was found in 1951, in the Gunnister burial on Shetland."^[2]

It has a pattern of three concentric diamonds made by rows of increases and decreases in the knitting.

Example #3: Eleonora of Toledo's red knitted silk burial hose contain eyelet patterns on the turn down cuff.



On the left: the existing stockings.

Below: a re-creation of her hose. "Pattern is redacted from photos and descriptions by various authors and researchers."^[5]


